GÀIDHLIG - HIGHER (continuing from National 5 Gàidhlig)

What are the aims of this course?

Higher is designed to develop further your understanding of the language and your ability to use the language independently.

What are the recommended entry levels for this course?

To continue into Higher you should have achieved National 5.

What content is included in this course?

As in National 4/5, the four language skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing are covered, but in greater detail, with grammar and sentence structure being given more emphasis. The course is largely literature-based, meaning, in practice, 20th century Gaelic short stories and poems. It is a fast-moving course and it is essential to prepare thoroughly for unit assessments and the final exam.

What skills will I develop?

Candidates will be expected to reach a much higher level of proficiency in the four components of reading, writing, listening and speaking. They should also understand that these components should strengthen each other. A deeper appreciation of Gaelic culture will enable them to place a text and its author in an appropriate context, as well as taking account of the intended readership / audience.

What learning and teaching approaches will I experience?

This course is mostly text-based but regularly employs some very useful on-line audio and video resources.

How will I be assessed?

You will be given regular feedback on your work. You will sit Unit Assessments in reading, listening, writing, and talking as the course progresses. You will sit a prelim exam which will help you check your progress. The Course Assessment will comprise a talking assessment and the final exam (critical reading and writing and a listening paper).
