- Below is some information on certain courses for your reference:

Environmental Science

Develops learners' interest and enthusiasm for environmental science in a range of contexts, as well as their investigative and experimental skills. Environmental science takes a problem-solving approach to attempt to develop solutions that prevent or reverse environmental deterioration and aim for sustainable practices.

Languages for Life and Work

Develops knowledge and skills in areas such as society, culture and employability. Learners can specialise in one or two Modern Languages

Engineering Science

Engineering is vital to everyday life; it shapes the world in which we live and its future. Engineers play key roles in meeting the needs of society in fields which include climate change, medicine, IT and transport.

Graphic Communication

Is practical, exploratory and experiential in nature. It combines elements of creativity and communicating for visual impact with elements of protocol and an appreciation of the importance of graphic communication standards

Design and Manufacture

Provides practical experience in product design and manufacturing. Creativity and technology makes this Course exciting and dynamic.

Early education and Childcare

Early Learning and Childcare is an introductory qualification that will help learners to understand some of the demands and responsibilities of working in the early learning and childcare sector.

People and Society

Will encourage learners to develop important attitudes, including: an open mind and respect for the values, beliefs and cultures of others, openness to new thinking and ideas, and a sense of responsibility and global citizenship.
