Careers Hive is a free immersive careers education event designed by Edinburgh Science to give students in S1-S3 a new way to think about their futures. Taking place over five days from Monday 6 to Friday 10 November 2023 at the National Museum of Scotland in Edinburgh, *Careers Hive* will provide S1 to S3 students with an exciting and memorable experience and inspire their thinking about what is possible with their careers.

Unlike traditional careers events, *Careers Hive* participants will take part in a curated 3-hour visit where groups will have the opportunity to engage with inspiring talks from motivational young speakers, participate in hands-on workshops that focus on students' unique skills, and meet early and mid-career professionals from a wide range of companies and enterprises to learn more about what it's really like to work in STEM fields.


