The Future Routes Fund was designed for young people by young people and is open to teams and individuals aged 11-26 from across Scotland who have an idea that would help young people connect with nature. We hope to turn some ambitious, inspiring, and exciting ideas into reality, empowering young people to deliver their own projects and have a positive impact on Scotland's biodiversity and climate. Individuals can apply for £500 to £2,000, and teams can apply for £1,000 to £5,000. A panel of young people will assess applications and decide which projects receive funding.

The Fund will be open for applications from 14 May to 19 June. Successful projects will need to be delivered by 30 of November 2024
